The time with our guests was very meaningful as we were privileged to have them join our worship services. Their presence in our building has been missed. Presently, we are in conversation with HELP to possibly extend a second welcome to our guests and we are looking forward to the possibility of having them return mid-February.

School Supplies (July – August) Over \$1000 worth of school supplies was given to Tarrant Middle School helping numerous students be prepared to learn

Crop Walk (September-October) \$1069 was given to Crop Walk along with Shoes for THRIVE and canned goods for the Food Bank

Samaritan's Purse (October - November) 41 filled boxes and \$410 donated to help spread Christianity and help children of the world have a wonderful Christmas.



Warming Tree (November-December) 5 huge bags for Four Oaks, including 19 warm coats, 30 pairs of socks, 10 stocking hats, 21 pairs of gloves/mittens, 7 scarves, 10 white T-shirts, 2 pairs of sweatpants, 2 sets of long johns, 4 sweaters, 1 flannel shirt, and 1 sweatshirt which equals 110 items to make winter more bearable for many!


