

Labor Day

Labor day usually symbolizes the end of summer and the start of a new school year. But, what is Labor Day? At the height of the Industrial Revolution, the average American worked 12-hour days, seven days a week. They endured harsh and unsafe work conditions, often times with little access to fresh air, sanitary facilities and breaks. As a result, strikes and rallies broke out in protest and many turned violent. On September 5, 1882, 10,000 workers took unpaid time off to march from City Hall to Union Square in New York City, holding the first Labor Day Parade.

In May of 1886, a group of workers called The Federation of Organized Trades and Labor Union had the idea to establish a "workingmen's holiday," a day of rest to enjoy time off from work. This day was meant to celebrate the achievements of American workers. Congress would not make the day a legal holiday until 12 years later, when they named the first Monday in September as a federal holiday. Labor Day is still celebrated across the United States with parades, picnics, barbeques and other public gatherings. Oh yes, and let's not forget—back to school.



On Sunday, September 11, 2022, the congregation voted to call a new minister to fill our current vacancy. Upon recommendation from the General Board, the congregation voted unanimously to call Mrs. Debbie Ott to serve First Christian as a student minister.

Debbie is starting the Student Ministry program this fall and she was recommended to the Search Committee by our Regional Minister, Rev. Bill Spangler-Dunning.

The student ministry program is operated by Disciples of Christ regions as a way of developing Commissioned Ministers. The program of becoming a Commissioned Minister takes a minimum of three years of rigorous educational requirements and practical experience and Virginia has one of the most rigorous programs.

As a sponsoring congregation, it will be our responsibility to work alongside Debbie and mentor her as she works to complete her studies and develop her skills as a minister.

This is the beginning of a new era in the life of our congregation and an opportunity to take a key role in helping to develop a new Disciples of Christ minister. Debbie's first service with us will be on October 2, 2022, and she looks forward to meeting everyone in the congregation and getting to know our church family.


