## COMMUNITY WARRIOR OF THE MONTH ELEANOR BROWN

When Eleanor Brown joined our congregation in 2016, having moved from Fredericksburg to be near Connie and Dennis, she immediately jumped into action at First Christian. Within a week or two, she joined the choir, started working at the Welcome Table, took over doing the laundry for the Welcome Table and joined the CWF and Sunday School. None of this was anything new for Eleanor. Her life of service to the church spans eight decades. While in Junior High School, she began attending Hilltop Christian Church in Mantua, Ohio, on her own. (None of the family attended church.) She joined Sunday School, CYF and Youth Choir, where she met Jack Brown, whom she ended up marrying at the age of 19. They started their family a year later and as soon as the kids were old enough she began leading the church's children's choir. She helped out in Bible School and continued in the adult choir and CWF for as long as the young family lived in Mantua. Outside of the church, Eleanor volunteered as a Girl Scout Leader. In 1967, the family moved to Dayton, Ohio, because Jack had taken a job with the government. The nearest DOC church was a half hour away, but she again joined the choir and CWF. Three and a half years later, Jack transferred to Alexandria, VA, so the family moved again. The nearest DOC was nearly an hour away. Jack and Eleanor felt that the kids, now in junior high and high school, needed to be in church with friends from school so the family joined Wesley United Methodist Church. True to tradition, she joined the choir and Sunday School and began helping out with the youth when needed. She was an officer in the United Methodist Women. Throughout the time the family lived in Alexandria, Eleanor regularly drove for Meals on Wheels and worked tirelessly with the Mount Vernon HS Band Boosters for eight years, in support of her family.

Upon retirement, Jack and Eleanor moved to Montross, VA, and not only continued with all of their prior regular church volunteering, but they began singing in a quartet that travelled extensively around the Northern Neck singing in retirement homes and other churches. At that time the two of them started driving for Hospice and often drove cancer patients to Richmond for treatments or surgeries. Eleanor eventually became the Hospice Coordinator for the entire Northern Neck.



The next chapter of Jack & Eleanor's life took them to Fredericksburg where they again became active in their church choir. Eleanor became an officer in the local United Methodist Women and was soon the treasurer for the entire Virginia District. During this time, Jack and Eleanor began going on Mission trips, traveling to Gulf Coast, other disaster areas, Appalachia, and the Red Bird Native American Mission to work building and repairing homes. Eleanor continued her work at the Red Bird Mission one last time after Jack's death 10 years ago. For Eleanor Brown, giving her time and talents to God has always been a fundamental, normal part of living. It's just who she is and what she has done every day of her life. God has richly rewarded her and is saying "Well done, good and faithful servant
